

I. B. (Beber) Helburn, Ph.D. has been arbitrating since 1970 and is an emeritus professor of the McCombs School of Business, The University of Texas at Austin, having retired from the faculty in August 1997, a semester short of 30 years, in order to pursue full-time arbitration. Prior to his retirement from active arbitration in September 2022, Beber was on the rosters of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service, the National Mediation Board and the American Arbitration Association. Much of his caseload derived from permanent panels involving the Internal Revenue Service and the National Treasury Employees Union and Customs and Border Protection and the National Treasury Employees Union, the U.S. Postal Service and its three major unions, and permanent panels involving several railroads and airlines and their unions.

Beber was admitted into the National Academy of Arbitrators in 1980 and has been active at both the regional and national levels, chairing the New Member Orientation Committee, two annual program committees, two Fall Educational Conference (FEC) program committees and three FEC local host committees. He has been a member of the Board of Governors and a Vice President as well as Chair of the Southwest-Rockies Region of the Academy.

For much of his arbitration career, Beber has taken on interns and has mentored aspiring arbitrators. A former intern and others who he has mentored are now members of the National Academy of Arbitrators or are working to qualify for Academy membership. Beber remains active on regional and national committees, in the training and mentoring of less experienced arbitrators and in working to improve diversity within the profession.
