Gwynne A. Wilcox is a partner of Levy Ratner, P.C., a New York law firm specializing in union-side labor law, employee benefits, bankruptcy, campaign finance, election law, civil rights and plaintiffs' employment law.

Prior to joining Levy Ratner, Wilcox worked as a Field Attorney at Region 2 of the NLRB in New York City. For union clients, she has supervised arbitration systems and assisted with other internal union matters. Wilcox currently serves as Associate General Counsel of 1199SEIU.

Wilcox serves as a labor representative to the New York City Office of Collective Bargaining deciding cases involving New York City agencies and unions representing New York City employees.

She is a 2017 honoree of the Syracuse University Chancellor's Citation for Distinguished Achievement "in honor of an exceptional career in law and dedication to advancing diversity." A 2009 recipient of the Peggy Browning Fund Lifetime Achievement Award, Wilcox is a member of the Board of the Peggy Browning Fund, a 2015 recipient of the Basil Paterson Award at the Labor Awards Breakfast hosted by the Amsterdam News and Bill Lynch Associates, and a 2015 recipient of the Brandworkers' Champion of Economic Justice Award at its Annual Awards Dinner. She is a fellow and former board member of the College of Labor and Employment Lawyers and is a board member of the Scheinman Institute on Conflict Resolution of the Cornell University ILR School and the Brandworkers. Wilcox is a past president and current advisory board member of the New York City chapter of the Labor and Employment Relations Association, and an Executive Committee member of the board of the Workers Defense League. She has served as a member of the Board of Directors of the AFL-CIO Lawyers Coordinating Committee, now known as the Union Lawyers Alliance, and worked on its diversity initiatives and has also served on the Labor Management Committee of the American Arbitration Association.

Wilcox is a former Union co-chair of the ABA Committee on the Development of the Law under the NLRA. She has served as an Editor and Associate Editor of Developing Labor Law, the preeminent labor law treatise. She was appointed to the Council of the ABA Section of Labor and Employment Law and is the Union and Employee Council Liaison to the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in the Legal Profession (DEILP) Committee and other committees. Recently, Wilcox was appointed to the New York State Bar Association Labor and Employment Law Section's Diversity Task Force. In celebration of the 2021 Black History Month, she was a co-presenter on the "We Make History: Amplifying the Black Experience in Labor and Employment" panel co-sponsored by the NYS Bar Association and the Cornell ILR Scheinman Institute.

Wilcox has authored and published numerous papers in the areas of labor law and technology issues in the workplace. She has made numerous presentations on arbitration, NLRA, and other areas of employment law to the American Bar Association, state bar associations, the National Academy of Arbitrators, and other groups. Also, she has taught labor law classes at the CUNY Murphy Institute and Cornell ILR School in New York City.
